

REDS WIN, 2-1, FROM PHILS IN NIGHT OPENER

Cincinnati, O., May 24.—(AP)—The Cincinnati Reds tonight launched their night baseball schedule, the first game ever played after dark in either major league, by defeating the Philadelphia Phillies, 2 to 1.

Crosley field, lighted by a \$50,000 illuminating system, was rigged up to provide enough candle power for the crowd of 20,422 and all players to see clearly, but nevertheless the Reds presented a lineup of minor league graduates who had been accustomed to playing under the lights. They dropped their National league regulars wherever possible and inserted every newcomer who last year had taken part in night baseball games.

Both teams started speed ball pitchers, and Paul Derringer was the winner, although he yielded six hits to the four made off Joe Bowman and his successor, Jim Bivin.

Billy Sullivan, former member of the Chicago White Sox and an American Association night baseball graduate by way of Milwaukee and St. Paul, made half of the Reds' hits and scored their second run.

In the fourth inning the Reds made their 34th double play of the season. Score:
